 Purpose is to identify areas of need for future research
 Add to the great work already done

Methods

- Journal of Life Care Planning 2004-2017
 Not exactly a content analysis (see what themes appear vs. identified themes)



levels of Research

- Primary (evaluee level)
- Secondary (practitioner level)
- Tertiary (profession level)



Type of Research

- Conceptual non empirical
 Simple Statistics Frequency Counts, measures of central tendency, non generalizable
- Complex Statistics inferential, advanced methodologies




Content Analysis

- Not establishing themes from the content; categorizing content based on themes.
- All articles were placed into preestablished categories based on 2004 Summit research priorities. This was done to measure under-researched Summit research priorities. This was done to measure under-researched areas.

 Implementation and Outcome of Patients
 Topics relating to specific disabilities or patient characteristics
 Topics relating to specific items or content of the plan, as well as provider treatments
 Topics relating to the creation process of plans, legal proceedings, and expert witnessing
 Topics or the efficacy of plans, including reliability studies, meaning assessing the outcomes of the plans or planning process
 Professionalization, including scope of practice, certification, accreditation, ethics and standards of practice
